Connecting researchers and studies with Australia's inherited cancer community

Inherited Cancers Australia (ICA) is the only national charity dedicated to supporting people and families affected by inherited cancer risk. Because of the strength, reach and trust within our community, researchers frequently approach ICA seeking access to our national network to support participant recruitment. This is a request to connect with a highly engaged, values-driven community that ICA has carefully built, nurtured and protected. We take this responsibility seriously.

To ensure we can continue enabling high-impact research in a way that is sustainable, ethical and respectful of our community, ICA has introduced a tiered **Research Recruitment Support Framework**. This framework helps us to:

- Match our level of support to the scope and resourcing of your study
- Protect our community from over-solicitation and research fatigue
- Sustain the infrastructure required to responsibly facilitate researcher-community connection

This approach recognises that meaningful access to our community requires time, governance oversight, and relationship management, all of which represented significant organisational investment.

- A highly engaged and segmented database of affected/unaffected individuals, demographics, lived experience characteristics

Requirements for research recruitment support

- Evidence of Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC) approval, or (where applicable) a pre-approval recruitment-of-interest summary
- A plain language description of the study suitable for community distribution.
- Documentation outlining participant safety measures and available support pathways
- Confirmation of agreement to provide a final plain language summary of study outcomes for dissemination to ICA and our community
- Approved logo usage and adherence to ICA and branding guidelines
- Appropriate acknowledgement of ICA as a recruitment partner in study materials

Provision of the above documentation does not guarantee approval. All applications are subject to review under ICA's Research Recruitment Support Framework.

Research recruitment application process

Researchers seeking recruitment support through ICA are required to complete a brief application form (available upon request). All applications are reviewed by ICA's Medical Advisory Committee to ensure alignment with community priorities, ethical standards, scientific rigour, and organisational capacity.

Following review, ICA will:

- Advise the outcome of the assessment
- Confirm eligibility under the Research Recruitment Support Framework
- Recommend the appropriate support tier and associated contribution

Upon confirmation, recruitment activities will be scheduled in accordance with the agreed framework parameters. Where applicable, ICA will provide engagement metrics and will reconnect following study completion to support dissemination of outcomes to the community.
